Getting Started

You will need to determine how you want to connect to our WebEx Classroom. You can connect from any device and any platform. If you are using an Android or iOS phone or tablet, download the WebEx Meetings App from the appropriate App Store (it should be free). If you will be using a Windows Computer, you can connect by your Web Browser, or Download the Window Desktop App.


Joining the Session

From a Desktop or Laptop App

- 1. Open the WebEx Meetings desktop App;
- 2. Sign in as prompted, or use as Guest;
- 3. In the Join Meeting box enter the Session Number provided and hit <Enter>;
- 4. When the session Window Opens, Login with the provided or requested information

From a Mobile App


- 1. Click the "Join" button on the notification or from the My Meetings page of the app.
- 2. Tap Join Meeting to enter the meeting number, URL, or username.





Useful Tips

- 1. When asked to enter your name, Use your Rank and Last name so we know who is connected (your e-mail address may be confusing)
- 2. When you connect, make sure you turn off your video and mute your phone if you are not talking.



The Participant Window


Once you have connected, you should see the participant window. At the top will be the presenter's Video, a list of Panelists who will be teaching, and a list of the Attendees in the session. This list can be long so you won't see everyone right away.

Beside your name you will see two buttons, a camera and a microphone. These are where you can turn on or off your video and audio feed. Most of the time these should be off unless you want to speak.

At the bottom, you will see the Feedback Bar. Here you can raise your hand to ask a question by clicking on the Hand Button, answer Yes or No to questions being asked using the Check or X buttons, or express your mood with one of the emoji available.

The Chat Window

The classroom also has a chat window you can turn on if it isn't displayed by default. Here you can send and receive messages to anyone in the classroom, or everyone if you choose. Select who you want to send messages to using the Send to dropdown list. Just remember, the host can see the whole conversation.



Classroom rules still apply!

While we are on-line, we are still in training so please remember to keep conversation in the chat area on topic, and try not to chat over each other. When you finish talking or asking your question, re-mute your microphone, and turn off your raised hand button so the instructor can get the next persons question.
